Current bylaw or policy section and language:

- 11.10 Age Groups
- (1) The point-scoring age groups shall be 8-under, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16 and 17-19. There shall also be a non-scoring 20-Over age group. Swimmers who are, or formerly were, a member of a college team during the current season are not eligible to score points, they will compete in the 20-over non-scoring age group (applies to Short Course Championship only).

- 11.10 Age Groups
- (1) The point-scoring age groups shall be **10 & Under**, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16 and 17-19. There shall also be a non-scoring 20-Over age group. Swimmers who are, or formerly were, a member of a college team during the current season are not eligible to score points, they will compete in the 20-over non-scoring age group (applies to Short Course Championship only).
- 11.19 Scoring Method

- (1) Individual Events: (1-16th place) 17-15-14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1
- (2) Relay Events: (1-8th place) 34-30-28-26-24-22-20-18
- (3) 8 & Under Scoring: points scored by the 8 & Unders age groups at the B Championship meet will be included in the overall team scores at the 12 & Under Championship meet.

Rationale:

One of the major topics discussed about the 12 & Under Champs meet is that the meet is too big and the sessions are too long. At 1 session per day with 350+ swimmers that is also getting too large for many of our facilities to host. This would help alleviate almost a hour and a half on both Saturday & Sunday using the 2025 meet timelines. This would allow for more opportunities to award swimmers during the meet, rather than at the end of the sessions as well.

For the 8 & Under swimmers, it would also help with long term athlete development and promote the B Champs meet more. Taking away time standards for 8 & Under swimmers encourages those new and younger swimmers to focus on building legal and proper stroke mechanics, rather than results at such a young age. By turning the 9-10 age group into a 10 & Under age group at the 12 & Under Champs meet you can still have the more advanced 8 year olds at that meet as well with more appropriate competition.

By starting every kid in the 8 & Under age group going to B Champs it also helps take away some of the stigma of having to go to B Champs when kids age up into new age groups and makes it more a regular part of everyone's swimming development.

We can add in the 8 & unders scores to help teams who may be concerned about losing those points at the championship meet.
